A home once associated with authority, intellect, and top-down decision-making now exists to **support listening, healing, and personal transformation**. Where national policies once had their roots, individual lives are now grounded and tended with care and compassion.

In that sense, the Fountain Hill Center does not erase the Bundy legacy; it **reframes it**. The house remains a place where **inner lives matter**, where **ethical responsibility is taken seriously**, and where the **consequences of power—personal and collective—are acknowledged**.

1884 - 1910

A wedding gift The Bundy Family

1910 - 1922

Sold to the Blair family who maintained for over a decade.

1922 - 1966

Irwin family (Irwin Seating Company) took ownership.

1966 - 1974

Central Reformed Church purchased, saved from demo by Heritage Hill Historic District.

1974 - 1975

The Marriage and Family Center was founded by Central Reformed Church, with the Center leasing the 1st floor.

1986

The Center expands lease to 2nd floor.

1991

The Center purchases the Bundy house with the help of a generous donor. Expanded to the 3rd floor.

1996

The Center rebranded itself as The Fountain Hill Center for Counseling & Consultation.

Today

The Bundy house serves as the Fountain Hill Center a nonprofit and mental health organization.
